Proposed amendments to address lowest-detectable THC levels HSC section 111922 (in red below; **black bolded amendments** already proposed and released to the author by GO.

SEC. 5. Section 111922 of the Health and Safety Code is amended to read:

- 111922. (a) The department, through regulation which shall be exempt from the Administrative Procedure Act (Chapter 3.5 (commencing with Section 11340) of Part 1 of Division 3 of Title 2 of the Government Code), may determine or modify maximum serving sizes for hemp-derived cannabinoids, hemp extract, and products derived therefrom, active cannabinoid concentration per serving size, the number of servings per container, and any other requirements for foods and beverages.
- (b) <u>Industrial hemp human food and beverage final form products</u> <u>Food and beverages</u> shall be prepackaged and shelf stable <u>and shall also meet the following:</u>
- (1) A single serving of an industrial hemp product will be based on the amount of food or beverage customarily consumed in one eating occasion for that food or beverage.
- (2) A single serving of an industrial hemp dietary supplement in pill, tablet, or capsule form shall be one unit.
- (3) A product shall not exceed 5 servings per package.
- (c)(1) An industrial hemp final form product shall not have a level of total THC that exceeds 0.001 mg/g. A qualified testing laboratory shall establish a Limit of Detection (LOD) of 0.001 mg/g or lower for total THC and a sample shall pass if total THC does not exceed the Limit of Detection.
- (2) "Limit of detection" (LOD) means the lowest quantity of a substance or analyte that can be distinguished from the absence of that substance within a stated confidence limit.
