U.S. Hemp Roundtable Applauds White House Call to Replace Hemp Ban with Regulatory Framework in New Funding Request

WASHINGTON, D.C. – The U.S. Hemp Roundtable applauds today's significant step by the White House, which as part of its supplemental funding request to Congress, explicitly calls for replacing the impending hemp ban with a robust regulatory framework, along the lines of [Amendment #54 to H.R. 8646](#), bipartisan language championed by Congressman Andy Barr. The Administration adds that at a minimum, the hemp ban moratorium, which is set to expire in November, should be extended – which would provide Congress more time to act on regulation.

Jonathan Miller, General Counsel of the U.S. Hemp Roundtable, issued the following statement:

"We are excited to see the President take such a strong public stance in favor of replacing the hemp ban with a strong regulatory framework, or at a minimum, securing an extension of the hemp ban moratorium to give Congress more time to develop regulations. This is an important step in honoring Congress' promise to help farmers and consumers."

The White House's request now puts the issue squarely in front of Congress as lawmakers consider the supplemental package in the days ahead.
